Job Summary

Performs duties as a referee in the all Youth Volleyball leagues and tournaments and acts as scorekeeper and maintains records.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

1. SERVES as the referee/official for youth volleyball leagues at various gymnasiums.

6. Ability to provide an appropriate whistle and court shoes.
