ACCEPTANCE OF AGENDA:

PUBLIC HEARING ON THE SECOND ALLOCATION OF CARES ACT FUNDS CDBG (CDBG-CV):

3. The City Council will hold a public hearing on Monday, January 25, 2021, at 5:30 p.m., at City Hall, on the City’s strategic use of the second allocation of CARES Act funds Community Development Block Grant (CDBG-CV) in the amount of \$369,490.00 to be addressed in the City of St. Joseph’s Consolidated Fifth Year Annual Plan to address the community needs to prevent, prepare for and respond to the Coronavirus using funds the City of St. Joseph will receive in fiscal year 2019/2020.

The purpose of the public hearing is to give residents and community organizations the opportunity to comment on the City of St. Joseph’s strategic use of available Community Development Block Grant-CV (CDBG-CV) funds the City receives through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). These Federal funds are intended to address the economic, housing and non-housing needs of low-moderate income residents and the areas in which they live that could be affected by the Coronavirus. At least 70% of the CARES Act funds must benefit low-moderate income individuals/families. The City will utilize funding amounts through the Consolidated Planning process as follows:

\$369,490 for Homeless Prevention services in the form of rent/mortgage and utility assistance to be administered by local social service agencies.

At this time, residents will be given an opportunity to express their views regarding the City’s use of these funds (see Agenda #17, Bill #1000-18).
